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competencies i.e. content knowledge, communication skills, teaching methods, assessment, and problem-solving were outlined in the research. (Firetto, 2021) the professional competencies of teachers consist of five areas of competency i.e., Competency in activity based teaching & hurdles, competency in child centred approach, competency in teaching-learning & their display, competency in evaluation techniques, competency in adopting novel strategies.
